Entry Requirements

- EU Citizen*
- At least sixteen years of age
- Candidates are required to obtain a Declaration of Fitness (from their local G.P.) to undertake this course
- Leaving Certificate, or equivalent qualification and/or relevant life and work experience
- Candidates are selected by interview

- QQI Certificate in Aquaculture

Duration

- QQI Foundation module may be completed in 40 hours training
- QQI Certificate in Aquaculture takes 4 months if taken full-time or approximately two years through part-time study.

Some modules are common to the QQI Certificate in Commercial Fishing to facilitate transfer between the catching and fish farming sectors.
