

Seed Mussel Survey Report for the Wicklow Area-8/04/2015 to 22/04/2015

Vessel: MV T'Burke (BIM), Skipper John Murphy, Survey Officer Nicolas Chopin

Equipment: 400 kHz side scan sonar, 1 meter dredge.

Area surveyed: from Five Miles Point (North) to Ballynacarrig/ Jack's Hole (South) within 5 nautical miles of the shore.

Survey summary:

Following the discovery of a very small settlement at the back of the Horseshoe Reef in late September 2014, it was decided to leave it in situ for the winter as it had the potential to stabilise the sediment in this area and to grow and accommodate a spring seed fishery in 2015.

A number of tows were taken in the area of the 2014 settlement, but only large starfish and small clumps of dead seed were picked up. Very few mussels are still alive in the area.

The survey was then extended to a wider area where seed was found in 2008, 2009 and 2010. A large area were covered with the side scan sonar (see Map 1), and 24 tows were made but no mussel was found.

Two areas were checked north of Wicklow but no seed was found (see Map 2).

Bottom type: Some improvement from previous years, stones and gravel with few sandy areas south of the head, gravel and stone on the north side.

Recommendations:

No over winter seed was found around Wicklow. The area will be resurveyed later in the season, once possible new spat has settled.
