- Business Mentoring and Capacity Development
- Upskilling and Training



What is the Blue Economy?

General Eligibility

- Businesses must be within 10km of coastline
- Entrepreneurial
- Be a micro or small enterprise
- The project must be relevant to the Blue Economy Sector and completed by 30 September 2023

Did you know that businesses in coastal communities across Ireland can apply for significant grant funding through the **Brexit Blue Economy** Enterprise Development Scheme?

The Scheme aims to stimulate growth in rural coastal communities across Ireland post-Brexit with funding available to businesses operating within 10 kilometres of the coastline and involved in the Blue Economy.

The Scheme, the largest of its kind ever, will have a

€25 million budget

available for the years 2022 and 2023, funded under the EU Brexit Adjustment Reserve.

It's designed to help strengthen and rejuvenate coastal communities by giving businesses an opportunity to apply for funding for their blue economy activities in areas including seafood, coastal tourism, boat building and repair, marine leisure and sport, and renewable energy initiatives.
