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Legislation

Single Use Plastics (SUP):

 Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on the reduction of the impact of certain plastic products on the environment, commonly referred to as the 'Single Use Plastics' Directive

Extended producer Responsibility (EPR):

 S.I. No. 612/2022 - European Union (Extended Producer Responsibility) (Fishing Gear Containing Plastic) Regulations 2022





Context

Competent Authorities:

DECC

EPA – responsible for reporting and monitoring.

Data Collection:

First reporting period: 2022

Gear Taxonomy – definitions and conversion factors.

Quality Report

Collect data on all fishing & aquaculture gear containing plastic that is:

- Placed on the Market (PoM)
- Taken off the Market (ToM)

End of life gear

- Separating retired gear from other wastes will increase the opportunities for use of these materials in a circular economy
- Separating materials e.g. Nets, Ropes, Bags – even better prospects for recycling.

Chapter 2 of the European List of Waste (LoW) Catalogue



Using a Waste Collector? **Don't Skip the Codes!**



When using a waste collector, let them know what type of waste you are putting in the skip and USE THE CORRECT CODE!

Some of the relevant codes from Chapter 2 of the European List of Wastes (LoW) catalogue:

02 01 04 For plastic (only) components such as twine, barrels, netting, rope, and bags

02 01 10 For metal from aquaculture gear

02 01 99 Waste gear (Fishing or aquaculture) not specified or segregated (mixed plastic, metal, rubber gear components) Weights recorded under accurate codes provide national data on waste gear coming off the market. Accurate information will allow the industry to identify the volumes of materials from retired aquaculture gear which in the future could be channelled towards the circular economy. The improved national data collection will improve how gear suppliers, users, ports, and industry associations work on the issue in partnership with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Bord Isscaigh Mhara (BIM), Irelands Seafood Development Agency.








Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Scheme

- Scheme in place by 31st
 December 2024
- Placing gear on the market / directly importing gear for your own use - then you will need to register with the EPR scheme.
- Scope of the EPR scheme covers the sale of all new gear when first placed on the Irish market.
- Similar schemes will operate in all EU coastal countries.
